Acts as a proof of agreements reached by the parties.



Supports order scheduling, expediting quality control and delivery follow-up tasks.



To establish trust, include delivery dates, times, receipts, and updates on the deliverables plan in case anything changes.



Helps to specify the buyer's order and record all of its criteria.

Tax Invoice:


The invoice, which is often issued to another enterprise, consists of all the elements of the tax invoice.

Invoice often issued B2C, containing key elements of a simplified tax invoice.


Tax Invoice elements:


Simplified Tax Invoice Items:

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How to apply e-invoicing at your facility:

To improve trade transparency, enterprises must integrate their systems with ZATCA, according to the Zakat, Tax, and Customs Authority (ZATCA). The standardization of invoice submissions to the system in a single machine-readable format is made possible by this integration. Additionally, it makes it simple for the Authority to spot fraudulent activity, and the usage of e-invoices creates a shared database for audit purposes. The tax authority can therefore keep an eye on transactions in real time, which lessens the need for regular audits.
